Day 3: Wednesday 7 December 2022

09h00 Session 6: Paper peer reviews in groups

This is the practical Writeshop activity. The idea is for each participant to assume three (3) roles: author, reviewer, and observer. Each role is distinct, and in each role, participants will be able to learn about publishing and publications from different specific angles or perspectives, which is important in the writing and publishing process.

- We will organize the participation into 5 groups with more or less 9-10 members per group: one hour discussion per paper.
- Format: 5 minutes opening pitch by the author: 10 minutes by assigned peer reviewer, 10 minutes by a member of the core organizers, 30 minutes open discussion, and 5 minutes closing by the author.
- Requirement: reviewers have to read the paper assigned to them in advance and prepare review comments.
- Prior to the Writeshop, or by 15 November, we will finalize subgroupings and ask participants to read papers in their subgroup.

Day 4: Thursday 8 December 2022

Field Trip: Full day (Leaving *early*)

One big bus to visit sites of land and agrarian struggles: farm workers and evictees and rural activists (with Women on Farms Project); urban land occupation movement and urban activists (indigenous leaders, Reclaim the City & Ndifuna Ukwazi) and sightseeing: Cape Point peninsula, beaches, Table Mountain and V&A Waterfront.
